
Laws

The Value of Integrity

Everyone seems to know what integrity is, but do you really? If you were asked, “What is integrity?” what would your answer be? To clarify the definition, I always turn to Webster’s dictionary. What I found was this: *Integrity: the entire, unimpaired state of anything, particularly of the mind; moral soundness or purity; incorruptness; uprightness, honesty.* Using a list of thoughts that I found on this subject, I would like to encourage you to think about integrity for a little while and see how valuable it is to you.

*Integrity serves as a guide in life’s moral decisions.

The integrity of the upright shall guide them: but the perverseness of transgressors shall destroy them. - Proverbs 11:3

Life is full of important decisions, from the everyday choices of what we are to wear, or eat, or where we are to go, to the life-changing selections of who we are to marry, how we are to live, and whom we will serve. It is the moral issues that should concern us the most. How will you conduct yourself? By what standard will you live? The worldly philosophy is that fornication is not wrong anymore. They try to convince you to treat your purity lightly as a thing that does not matter. Most young people today are so filled with the idea that they cannot live above sin that they feel there is no need to try, therefore with the overwhelming pull of worldly influences (pornography, peer pressure, worldly music and magazines, romance books,...just to name a few), they are drawn into a net of destruction where their integrity is crushed and ruined. You can retain your integrity and you can hold to the decision to do right, no matter what. Keep that which is holy for Holy Matrimony, now and forever.

*Integrity hates falsehood in every form.

A righteous man hateth lying: but a wicked man is loathsome, and cometh to shame. Righteousness keepeth him that is upright in the way: but wickedness overthroweth the sinner. - Proverbs 13:5-6

You have seen it before, someone starts lying to get out of trouble and pretty soon he has told so many lies he slips up and says something he should not and is caught. And what is the first thing he does? He starts lying again to try to get out of trouble. The thing about a liar is that he does not care to make someone else look bad just so he can make himself look better. Those are the kinds of things that I would think were *loathsome*. Hate lying! Hate it for what it is; sin. Sin always brings death and the one thing that lying can kill is your integrity. No one ever believes a liar. You might get away with it for a little while but lies always come out. Always! Lying is never right under any circumstance. If it means that you will get into trouble, then take the punishment that you deserve but do not lie! The best thought is just do nothing that you would not want everyone to know about, then you do not have to be ashamed and you will have no reason to lie.

*Integrity keeps its word even when it hurts.

The tongue of the wise useth knowledge aright: but the mouth of fools poureth out foolishness. A wholesome tongue is a tree of life: but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit. – Proverbs 15:2,4

Back in my grandfather’s day, if a man said that he would do something, it was as binding as if he had signed a contract. The old saying was, “A man’s word is as

good as his bond.” But honesty and faithfulness is a rarity these days and there are very few that you can trust to keep their word with only a handshake and a promise. A person who is concerned in keeping his integrity will keep their word at all costs. Solomon said, “*Better is it that thou shouldst not vow, than that thou shouldst vow and not pay.*” (Ecc.5:5) If you have any doubt that you cannot fulfill the promise that you start to make, do not make it. I personally know people who will tell you they will do something when they have no intention of doing it. Everyone loses trust in a person like that and when they need someone to really believe them, no one takes them seriously. So keep your word. Do what you say you will do. “*The eyes of the LORD are in every place, beholding the evil and the good.*” (Pro.15:3)

*Integrity is not afraid to run when evil comes knocking.

Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart. - 2Tim. 2:22

The apostle Paul gave very precise instructions about how to handle sin...FLEE! *Flee fornication.* (1Cor 6:18) *Flee from idolatry.* (1Cor 10:14) *But thou, O man of God, flee these things* (foolish and hurtful lusts, the love of money); *and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness.* (1Tim 6:11) There is no better way for you to resist the temptations that come your way every day. When you are tempted to do something wrong, flee! When you pick up a magazine and it is full of bad pictures and worldly philosophy, drop it and run! If someone wants you to join them in something that you know is wrong, turn around and leave them in the dust. If you will turn away from evil and put it out of your mind, replacing it with good things as scripture, good songs, or even just to know that the thing you were thinking of is hurting the Lord, it will be of more help to you than you would ever imagine. And you will find that when you do, the devil will leave you alone, also. *Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.* (James 4:7) Moses did it! Joseph did it! Daniel did it! You and I can do it, too!

*Integrity backs up what it says with how it lives.

In all things showing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine showing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you.-

Titus 2:7,8)

One thing that burdens my heart and I believe burdens the Lord, too, is people, young and old, who claim to be Christians and will act good, talk right, dress Godly, while they are in the presence of other Christians but then will act worldly, talk with vulgar slang and dress ungodly when they are anywhere else. This not only hurts the cause of Christ but also destroys their testimony with others who are watching them. *Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you.* (2Corinthians 6:17) It is time that we as Christians stand up for what we believe and follow the Lord in holiness and integrity. If you are a Christian and love the Lord Jesus Christ, then look like one, talk like one, and let your light shine in this dark world for others to see. The choice is yours. Will God have preeminence in your life or will you fit in with the world so well they cannot tell you are a Christian?

*Integrity says both *yes* and *no* and means what it says.

But above all things, my brethren, swear not, neither by heaven, neither by the earth, neither by any other oath: but let your yea be yea; and your nay, nay; lest ye fall into condemnation. - James 5:12

There is never a question about what is right and what is wrong. You have established in your heart and soul the principles by which Christ would have you live and there is no problem of you not knowing what to do or say in any situation. Some think that you can not live that way, that there are too many situations where one thing is right and another time that it is wrong, but that is not true. There is never a time that you need to do wrong to be right! Jesus had the answer to all those problems, namely; *“But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy.”* Always be honest in all you say and do, with love and tact.

*Integrity is what God looks for in a person’s character.

I know also, my God, that thou triest the heart, and hast pleasure in uprightness. – 1Chr. 29:17

Being a parent, I know how very much joy and contentment I get from knowing that my children love me enough to do what is right without correction. The peace and fellowship at those times is heavenly. Is it so hard to understand, then, how we make the heart of God feel when we love him enough to walk in integrity and live to please him? We bring joy to our earthly parents with obedience and love and it is just as sure that we bring joy to our heavenly Father with the same thing. He will try your heart (put you through certain tests of endurance and patience) to see what kind of integrity you really have. He wants you to see yourself as you really are, not what you strive to be. If the way of integrity is too hard for you and the temptations of the world are too strong, I beg you to consider the sincerity of your own commitment to Christ. If you are a part of the Bride of Christ, worldly ambitions and temptations to follow after worldly influences do not have the pull that they once had. That does not mean that you will not be tempted, only now sinful pleasures and indulgences are hateful things to you because of the love that you have for Jesus. To please Him and prove your love for Him will become your greatest desire, and in doing so it will fill your life with joy and the sweet peace of God.

Cooking Counter

Orange Spice Bread

- 2 packages (7 ounces each) bran muffin mix
- ½ cup raisins
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup orange juice concentrate, thawed
- ½ cup orange marmalade, divided
- 4 tablespoons vegetable oil
- ¼ cup milk
- 2 teaspoons ground allspice



Preheat oven to 400°. Combine muffin mix and raisins. Add eggs, orange juice concentrate, 6 tablespoons orange marmalade, oil, milk, and allspice; stir until well blended. Pour into 4 greased and floured 3¼ x5¼ inch loaf pans. Bake 20 to 25 minutes or until a tooth pick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove loaves from pans and place on wire rack. Spread remaining orange marmalade evenly over tops of hot loaves. Cool completely. Store in an airtight container. (Note: The loaves can be baked larger, or this size for gifts. Gift idea on Craft page.)

Apple Strudel



- 2/3 cup milk, scalded
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 1/4 teaspoons salt
 - 6 tablespoons butter, melted
 - 2/3 cup water, lukewarm
 - 2 tablespoons sugar
 - 2 packages active dry yeast
 - 3 eggs
 - 6 cups flour
- Scald milk in a saucepan. Add

- Filling:**
- 9 apples, peeled and sliced
 - 1 1/2 cups cream
 - 1 1/2 cups sugar
 - butter
 - cinnamon

butter. Dissolve yeast in lukewarm water; add sugar and set aside to proof, about 10 minutes. When milk and butter mixture is between 100 and 110 degrees F. (warm to the touch), stir in the yeast mixture. Using a whisk, beat the eggs well and stir in to combine. Gradually add in 3 cups of flour, beating until smooth with electric mixer. Stir in remaining flour, or enough to make a soft dough (about 3 cups). Place in a greased bowl, turning once to cover with oil. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk, about 1-2 hours. Turn out onto lightly floured board and divide into three pieces. Roll out each piece and stretch with hands to fit into a 11x11x3 inch pan. Press edges tightly against pan so that it doesn't spring back. If dough is too elastic, place on counter, cover with a bowl so that it doesn't dry out and allow to rest for 30 minutes. This will relax the gluten and the dough will become more manageable. Peel and core apples and slice thinly. Arrange the apples lengthwise in rows across the strudel dough. Cover loosely with plastic wrap and allow to rise in a warm, draft-free place until doubled in bulk. Remove wrap. Into each of the three pans, pour 1/2 cup cream. Cover apples in each pan with a mixture of ½ cup sugar and sprinkle liberally with cinnamon. Starting with the long end, roll up jell-roll style into a log. Form log into a horse-shoe or U-shape. Brush top with milk or cream and sprinkle with sugar. Bake in a preheated 350 degrees F. oven until lightly golden, about 35 minutes. Puncture bubbles.

1/2 gallon apple cider **HOT SPICED APPLE CIDER**

- 12 cloves
- 3 cinnamon sticks
- 1 c. orange juice
- 1/2 c. lemon juice

Heat apple cider. Add all ingredients. Allow the mixture to simmer for half hour or more. Serve this in mugs on a chilly night. Makes 12 servings.

To create a "spraying stand" for beads, poke 11 straight pins all the way through a scrap of cardboard and
turn cardboard over. Slip beads onto pins, spray with protective coating and let dry. Lift beads off pins
when dry.) Position small wooden bead onto center of help twine. Add smallest paper bead by threading
twine ends all the way through opposite ends of bead. Add a small wooden bead to each end of twine,
then through opposite ends of next larger paper bead. Repeat until five paper beads have been strung to
create pendant. Add a large wooden bead to each end of twine. Using photo as guide, string paper beads
and large wooden beads to complete necklace. When necklace is long enough to slip over head, tie twine
ends together and secure with dot of glue; let dry. Trim excess twine.

You can either purchase an unfinished shadow box at a craft store or keep your eyes open at rummage sales for a flat, shallow box that would do. It is best to have a way to cover your treasures with glass to protect from dust. Use lace hankies or crocheted items made by the person, personal items such as knives, watches, rings, or jewelry of any kind. Always be sure to have their name printed somewhere, and pictures if possible, so all will know for whom the box was made.
